RESOLUTION #2021-101 OF THE LUMMI INDIAN BUSINESS COUNCIL

Title: Banishment of Tony Lee Williams

WHEREAS, the Lummi Indian Business Council (LIBC) is the duly constituted governing body of the Lummi Indian Reservation by the authority of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Lummi Nation of the Lummi Reservation, Washington, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the LIBC is responsible for advancing the health, safety, well-being and education goals of the people of the Lummi Nation; and

WHEREAS, it is the mission of the LIBC "To Preserve, Promote and Protect our Sche Lang en" (LIBC Resolution #2012-025); and

WHEREAS, the power to declare "banishment" predates the Treaty of Point Elliot, as a matter of traditional and cultural law, and inclusion of such concepts and powers in the treaty and Lummi Constitution is only a manifestation of some of the powers delegated and are only a part of those rights reserved to the LIBC under the Lummi Constitution under Article VI, Sections 1, 2, and 3. Such reserved powers were and have been recognized in *United States v. Winans*, 198 U.S. 371, 381 (1905), which states a treaty "was not a grant of rights to the Indians, but a grant of rights from them - a reservation of those not granted;" and

WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 1, (j) of the 2006 Lummi Constitution provides that the LIBC has the authority "To exclude from the restricted land of the Lummi Reservation persons not legally entitled to reside therein, under ordinances which shall be subject to the approval of the Lummi Nation General Council;" and

WHEREAS, the LIBC has enacted Title 12 Exclusion Code which acknowledges the historical practice of banishment by the Lummi people, stating that "individuals that posed a threat to the community were sometimes banished and excluded from Lummi Territory." LCL 12.01.020. LCL 12.01.020(b) acknowledges and respects "the authority of the LIBC to exercise its inherent sovereign right to banish an individual from the Lummi Reservation;" and

WHEREAS, TONY LEE WILLIAMS, DOB: 01/06/1982, a non-tribal individual, was convicted of Distribution of a Controlled Substance Containing Fentanyl and Possession of a Firearm in Furtherance of a Drug Trafficking Crime in a Federal Case 2:19CR000193RAJ-001. The conduct of Mr. Williams resulted in the death of a Lummi Tribal member within the Lummi Reservation; and

WHEREAS, Tony Lee Williams, through his personal conduct, is an immediate and imminent threat to the safety, health, and welfare of the Lummi Community and is eligible for banishment from the Lummi Reservation.

NOW, THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED, in accordance with the inherent sovereign right of the Lummi Nation, the LIBC finds the person **Tony Lee Williams** is a threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the Lummi nation and hereby **BANISHES** him from the Lummi Reservation, its Trust Lands, and all tribal enterprises by the Lummi Indian Business Council; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Council Operations shall forward a copy of this resolution to the Lummi Nation Police Department. The Lummi Nation Police Department is to serve copies of this resolution to **Tony Lee Williams** and instruct him to leave the boundaries of the Lummi Reservation and its Trust Lands immediately upon receipt of this Resolution. If Mr. Williams is incarcerated, the Lummi Nation Police Department shall fax this Resolution to the facility where he is held. The Lummi Nation Police Chief shall provide written proof of service directly to the Lummi Indian Business Council within five days of service. A copy of this Resolution shall be forwarded by the Council Operations to Lummi Communications who shall post this resolution in all appropriate platforms; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, if **Tony Lee Williams** is found within the boundaries of the Lummi Reservation or its Trust lands, it shall be considered a violation of an exclusion order and he shall be charged with Trespass under RCW 9A.52.070 and his property will be subject to impoundment and forfeiture; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Tony Lee Williams may petition the Lummi Indian Business Council to lift this banishment order. He must appear in front of the Lummi Indian Business Council to explain why he should be allowed within the boundaries of the Lummi Reservation or Trust Lands. The LIBC may lift this Banishment Resolution upon two-thirds vote in support of lifting this Resolution; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, the Chairman, (or Vice Chair in his absence) is hereby authorized and directed to execute this resolution and any documents connected therewith, and the Secretary, or the Recording Secretary in his absence, is authorized and directed to execute the following certification.
